Affordable Care Act Grievance Procedure January 7, 2019

It is the policy of Advantia Health and its medical practices not to discriminate on the basis of race, color, national origin, sex, age or disability. Your Advantia Health practice has adopted an internal grievance procedure providing for prompt and equitable resolution of complaints alleging any action prohibited by Section 1557 of the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act of 2010 (42 USC 18116) and its implementing regulations at 45 CFR part 92, issued by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services.

Section 1557 prohibits discrimination on the basis of race, color, national origin, sex, age or disability in certain health programs and activities. Section 1557 and its implementing regulations may be examined in the office of Advantia Health's Civil Rights Coordinator, 1525 Wilson Boulevard, Suite 540, Rosslyn, VA, 20009, 202-552-1335, who has been designated to coordinate the efforts of Advantia Health to comply with Section 1557.

Any person who believes someone has been subjected to discrimination on the basis of race, color, national origin, sex, age or disability may file a grievance under this procedure. It is against the law for Advantia Health to retaliate against anyone who opposes discrimination, files a grievance, or participates in the investigation of a grievance.

Procedure:

- Grievances must be submitted to the Advantia Health's Civil Rights Coordinator within 60 days of the date the person filing the grievance becomes aware of the alleged discriminatory action.
- A complaint must be in writing, containing the name and address of the person filing it. The
 complaint must state the problem or action alleged to be discriminatory and the remedy or relief
 sought.
- Advantia Health's Civil Rights Coordinator shall investigate the complaint. This investigation may be informal, but it will be thorough, affording all interested persons an opportunity to submit evidence relevant to the complaint. The Coordinator will maintain the files and records of Advantia Health relating to such grievances. To the extent possible, and in accordance with applicable law, the Coordinator will take appropriate steps to preserve the confidentiality of files and records relating to grievances and will share them only with those who have a need to know.
- Advantia Health's Civil Rights Coordinator will issue a written decision on the grievance, based on a
 preponderance of the evidence, no later than 30 days after its filing, including a notice to the
 complainant of their right to pursue further administrative or legal remedies.
- The person filing the grievance may appeal the decision of Advantia Health's Civil Rights Coordinator by writing to the Advantia Health Chief Executive Officer (CEO) within 15 days of receiving the Coordinator's decision. The CEO shall issue a written decision in response to the appeal no later than 30 days after its filing.

The availability and use of this grievance procedure do not prevent a person from pursuing other legal or administrative remedies, including filing a complaint of discrimination on the basis of race, color, national origin, sex, age or disability in court or with the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, Office for Civil Rights. A person can file a complaint of discrimination electronically through the Office

Complaint forms are available at: http://www.hhs.gov/ocr/office/file/index.html. Such complaints must be filed within 180 days of the date of the alleged discrimination.

Advantia Health's Civil Rights Coordinator will make appropriate arrangements so that individuals with disabilities and individuals with limited English proficiency are provided auxiliary aids and services or language assistance services, respectively, if needed to participate in this grievance process. Such arrangements may include, but are not limited to, providing qualified interpreters, providing taped cassettes of material for individuals with low vision, or assuring a barrier-free location for the proceedings. Advantia Health's Civil Rights Coordinator will be responsible for such arrangements.
